RE: Connecticut General Statutes-Section 16-245m(d) – Connecticut’s Conservation and Load Management Plan for 2019 through 2021 - 2019 Plan Update

Dear Deputy Commissioner Sotos:

The Connecticut Light and Power Company (“CL&P”) and Yankee Gas Services Company (“YGS”), doing business as Eversource Energy (“Eversource”), and The United Illuminating Company (“UI”), Connecticut Natural Gas Corporation (“CNG”), Southern Connecticut Gas (“SCG”), collectively, UIL Holdings Corporation (“UIL”), are submitting their 2019 Update of the 2019-2021 Plan pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 16-245m(d).

Enclosed for the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection’s (“DEEP”) review are copies of the 2019 Update of the 2019 to 2021 combined Electric and Natural Gas Conservation and Load Management Plan (the “2019-2021 Plan”) and the 2019 Program Savings Document (“PSD”).

The Companies have worked closely with the Energy Efficiency Board consultants to develop the 2019-2021 Plan updates which reflect the 2018 Carry over/(under) into 2019 and have adjusted the discount rate in the Benefit-Cost Models to use a nominal discount rate of 3% per

DEEP Compliance Item No. 5 in Attachment A of the DEEP Schedule of Compliance Conditions of Approval, dated December 20, 2018.

Table 1-1 from the 2019-2021 Plan Update highlights the Plan Savings and Benefits. Relative to the 2019-2021 Plan's (filed on November 19, 2019) total values, Table 1-1 below reflects a 3% increase in Budgets and a 10% increase in Lifetime Benefits.
